The later models had either longer metal sup Experts a metal support under the horn. I have a MK9 horn that has totally folded over and I keep meaning to "steam" it back into shape. I suggestions from people who have successfully done this before. Here are a few methods and advic 1. Steam slowly or the outer layers of paper will fall off. 2. Use a jig to hold the mouth of the horn in a perfect circle or it will dry warped. 3. Once damp, fill it with sand to dry. 4. Hang it upside down when storing and only turn it when playing. Eventually it will sort itself out 5. Attach a rope to the bell and the other end to the ceiling and over months slowly tighten the red. 	I have had several e I have heard of.
